

## Intermediate Lesson 3: Biblical Leadership

Biblical leadership is servant leadership, rooted in humility, character, and purpose. This lesson explores what it means to lead like Christ using principles from passages such as Mark 10:42–45, 1 Timothy 3:1–13, and Titus 1:6–9. Students will learn how biblical leaders are called to serve others, steward their influence, and walk in spiritual authority with integrity.
